080 Barcelona Fashion opens its 37th edition at Port Vell with 26 fashion shows and the debut of Adolfo Domínguez on the brand's 50th anniversary

- **ESCORPION, SKFK, BOLAÑO, CUSTO BARCELONA and ADOLFO DOMÍNGUEZ** are the brands taking centre stage on this first day
- The platform includes spaces that are open to the public, with live broadcasts in the Open Area and creative activities to experiment with design

Tuesday, 14 April 2026.- The Departament d'Empresa i Treball, through the Consorci de Comerç, Artesania i Moda de Catalunya (CCAM), and Barcelona City Council have opened the 37th edition of 080 Barcelona Fashion at Port Vell (Rambla del Rompeolas and Marina Vela). For four days, the platform presents an expanded line-up of up to 26 fashion shows that combine established designers, international debuts and new creative voices, thus underpinning its vocation as a benchmark for fashion with a global reach.

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One of the major new features of this event is the onboarding of Adolfo Domínguez, who is making his debut at 080 Barcelona Fashion on the label's 50th anniversary. International brands such as Nazzal Studio, a Palestinian studio based in Jordan, and David Catalan, a Spanish designer based in Porto, are also joining in, while expanding the geographical and creative diversity of the line-up.

This year's edition, which runs until 17 April, features the following labels: AAA Studio, Adolfo Domínguez, Benavente, Bibencia, Bolaño, Boulard, Carrieri, Coconutscankill, Custo Barcelona, David Catalan, Doblás, Dominnico, Eñaut, Escorpion, Guillermo Justicia, Habey Club, Maison Moonsieur, Nazzal Studio, Reparto, Ricardo Seco, Rubearth, SKFK, Tania Marcial, Txell Miras, Víctor von Schwarz and XVStrange.

In addition to the fashion shows, this edition features 080Spot_SpainGallery, an initiative that combined 080 Barcelona Fashion and Spain Gallery to promote designer fashion, with daily talks and workshops in the Open Area. The space features twenty-one brands: Alineo, Hune, Jane Bardot, Tarti Tailored, María Ruiz, Better Late, Papi y Mami, Bico, Dimoni Studio, Etéme, Mané Mané, Cillán, Utahia, Maikarfi, Flama, Ma Gari, Paola Molet, Salazar Studio, Pringa Studio, Eaftimos and Caducifolium.

Artesania de Catalunya is launching 080_BeyondCrafts for the second time, a space for thought on the creative processes of present-day craftsmanship and its relationship with fashion and culture. The second edition focuses on bags, while showcasing pieces that redefine this field and bring to the fore its conceptual and technical richness, under the creative direction of Guillermo Solas.

Also featured is BARCELONA FASHION FORWARD, a programme that supports and guides emerging fashion designers and brands with the aim of optimising and boosting their professionalisation.

Tradition and innovation kick off the 37th edition

On this first day, ESCORPION, SKFK, BOLAÑO, CUSTO BARCELONA and ADOLFO DOMÍNGUEZ have taken to the catwalk, thus combining established labels with new creative approaches.

ESCORPION

ESCORPION has opened the catwalk of the 37th edition with a collection that bolsters its role as a benchmark in international knitwear. The brand, which was

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founded in 1929 and operates in more than 20 countries, presents its collection under Jessica Raya's creative direction.

"Heritage" champions knitwear as a language in its own right through overcoats, jackets, chunky-knit jumpers, cardigans and dresses that define the silhouette. Hand-crafted structures, dense textures and balanced volumes highlight the craftsmanship, with wrap-around necklines and wide sleeves that add structure. The colour range combines earthy and green shades that evoke nature, with touches of primary colours that add energy and contrast. A collection that celebrates community work and shared knowledge, thus positioning knitwear as a strategic category.

SKFK

SKFK, a brand that was established in Bilbao under the creative direction of Maia Curutchet, has presented a collection that is based on craftsmanship and a connection with the land, with Fairtrade and GOTS certifications guaranteeing its environmental and social standards.

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“*Lotura*”, which means “bond” in Basque, is based on respect for the land and for those who work it with their hands. The collection champions the bond with nature and the artisanal gesture through braiding, a traditional technique brought into our present day as a symbol of patience and detail. A collection that invites us to rediscover what is essential in a world that is digitally hyperconnected, but often disconnected from nature.

BOLAÑO

Manuel Bolaño has brought his delicate and theatrical aesthetics to the catwalk with a collection that blends romanticism and artisanal memory. The Barcelona-based designer, who has designed costumes for the film *La Piedad* and the series *Silencio* by Eduardo Casanova, builds custom-made garments by hand, thus tapping into the legacy of traditional workshops.

“*Plan B*” blooms like a garden in the shadows where Atelier Bolaño’s iconic garments coexist. The romanticism of the 19th century and the echo of haute couture from the 50s and 60s engage in a dialogue with the naivety, kitsch and melancholic tenderness.

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Noble fabrics, unexpected volumes and a modern silhouette made with patient hands evoke cinema, music and the immortal shadow of Anna Maria Mazzini.

ADOLFO DOMÍNGUEZ

Adolfo Domínguez closed the first day with its debut at 080 Barcelona Fashion on the label’s 50th anniversary. The trailblazing Galician company in terms of internationalisation and the first Spanish fashion brand to be listed on the stock exchange presents a collection that returns to the label’s origins through experimentation.

“*El Número*” reinterprets Adolfo Domínguez’s classic tailoring for everyone: blazers with accentuated shoulder pads and offset armholes, hybrid garments, where shirts want to be sweaters and skirts are intended to be trousers.

The workshop tools – rulers, tape measures and squares – are turned into graphics and prints, while Adolfo’s favourite tree, the magnolia, appears in a photographic print that captures the ephemeral beauty of the moment. The collection celebrates its 50th anniversary with hints that highlight the label’s track record.
