## The second day of 080 Barcelona Fashion at Port Vell conveys seven creative universes inspired by cultural, cinematic and ancestral references

- CARRIERI, AAA STUDIO, BOULARD BARCELONA, XV STRANGE, VÍCTOR VON SCHWARZ, TXELL MIRAS and DOMINNICO present their collections for the catwalk

**Barcelona, 15 April 2026.**- The second day of the 080 Barcelona Fashion event, which is organised by the Generalitat de Catalunya (Regional Government of Catalonia), through the Consorci de Comerç, Artesania i Moda de Catalunya (CCAM), within the Departament d'Empresa i Treball, together with Barcelona City Council, has brought to the fore the creative richness of a generation of designers who produce collections based on their concept, narrative and unique world view.

From Carrieri's retrogalactic aesthetics to the emotional armour with which Dominnico celebrates its tenth anniversary, through Boulard's epistolary romanticism or Txell Miras' conceptual strength, the day provided a journey through universes as diverse as they are consistent.

Seven brands hit the catwalk throughout the day: CARRIERI, AAA STUDIO, BOULARD BARCELONA, XV STRANGE, VÍCTOR VON SCHWARZ, TXELL MIRAS and DOMINNICO.

In the Open Area, talks and workshops open to the public were held, as well as live broadcasts. The talk *“The power of styling – identity, image and creative direction”* and the biomaterials workshop with Caducifolium have bolstered the educational and creative scope of the day.

## **CARRIERI**

Carrieri, a brand established in Argentina by Lucas Carrieri and currently based in Madrid after a migration process, presented “Star Fox”, a collection that revisits the retrogalactic aesthetics of the 90s via a modern language.

Wrap-around silhouettes, cutouts inspired by vector landscapes and structures reminiscent of pilot uniforms are combined with metallic accessories and a vibrant colour range that evokes 16-bit graphics. The narrative encompasses upcycling practices and recycled materials, while putting ergonomics and usefulness at the service of genderless 2.0 streetwear aesthetics.

## AAA STUDIO

AAA Studio, a Barcelona brand that was established by Arnau Climent from the link between fashion and the performing world, presented “¡¡¡Señora, suélteme el brazo!!!” (Let go of my arm, ma’am!), a generational and protesting collection made up of multi-positional and adjustable garments.

With its punk-rock aesthetics based on neutral colours and bright touches, the collection challenges rigid clothing standards and embraces freedom, chaos and contradiction as creative values, while maintaining multi-position and adjustability as the brand’s defining essence.

## BOULARD BARCELONA

Ugo Boulard, a Barcelona designer taking part in the Barcelona Fashion Forward programme, presented “With Kind Regards”, his first catwalk proposal structured in three chapters and inspired by the epistolary universe.

The collection blends ornamental detail, modernist sensitivity and artisanal work to introduce the label’s first feminine looks. Layers, textures and references to personal memory shape romantic Barcelona aesthetics.

## **XV STRANGE**

XV STRANGE, a label established in Madrid in 2018 by Devins Kulmancha and Jack Lucid, two Guinean designers who understand art at the root of their creation, has presented “WOSONGLE”, a unisex collection that views fashion as a living language that interacts with cultural and ancestral roots.

The garments, which are created as art objects, turn traditional materials and techniques into modern and sustainable aesthetics, based on small-scale production and the use of textile surpluses.

## **VÍCTOR VON SCHWARZ**

Víctor von Schwarz, a Barcelona designer who presented a collection for people with functional disabilities at the Singapore Fashion Council in 2025, has presented “Final Girl”, a collection that takes its cue from the figure of the final girl in horror films to explore resilience and self-defence.

Versatile silhouettes without gender hierarchies blend daytime materials – poplins and cottons – with nighttime textures – chantilly, tulle and faux fur – in a range of pinks, maroons and dark shades that balance innocence and theatricality.

## **TXELL MIRAS**

Txell Miras, a Catalan designer who recently created the costumes for the inaugural ceremony of the America's Cup and the uniforms of the Orfeó Català, has presented “Una llàgrima simplificada en el desig” (A Simplified Tear in Desire), a conceptual collection that imbues the patterns and textures with the emotional undergrowth of desire and loneliness.

Minimalist silhouettes, deconstructing and a contrasting colour range between pure whites, metallics and earth shades create garments that play with layers, controlled volumes and illustrations of half-finished faces.

## **DOMINNICO**

DOMINNICO, a genderless ready-to-wear brand established in Barcelona in 2016 by Domingo Rodríguez Lázaro, who has dressed international artists, such as Beyoncé, Rosalía and Lady Gaga, and has been part of the Renaissance World Tour, closed the day with “Soft Armour”, a collection that celebrates the brand’s tenth anniversary.

The collection explores the duality between strength and sensitivity: leather, denim and double-sided coats coexist in pastel shades and more forceful colours, thus claiming softness as a form of protection. The label, alongside Vinted, recontextualises consumption symbols as a critique of performative identity, thus underpinning its inclusive and slow fashion vision.
